** Students should select an "Area of Interest" in conjunction with an academic advisor by the time they have completed HDFS 235. See advisor for details and required form. Fifteen (15) credits of restricted electives are required for an "Area of Interest." These may be selected from within, and outside of, the College of Education and Human Development. Developmental electives must be related to area of interest.

NOTE: A grade of C- or better must be earned in all required HDFS and EDUC courses and Restricted Electives. A student failing to meet the minimum required grade of C- when taking a major course for the second time will not be permitted to remain in an HDFS major requiring that course. The student may present a letter of appeal to his or her advisor who will forward the case to the appropriate screening committee.
