NOTE: A grade of C- or better must be earned in all required HDFS and EDUC courses and Restricted Electives. A student failing to meet the minimum required grade of C- when taking a major course for the second time will not be permitted to remain in an HDFS major requiring that course. The student may present a letter of appeal to his or her advisor who will forward the case to the appropriate screening committee.
