**NOTES**: This is only a planning guide. Please refer to your course catalog for official requirements. An effort should be made to schedule courses in the year indicated, although some adjustments may be necessary as not every course is offered every semester. A grade of C- or better is required for all University Breadth requirement courses, all required HDFS courses and Developmental, At Risk, and Restricted Electives.

- A. Statistics options: MATH 201, MATH 205, STAT 200, PSYC 209 (Psychology majors/minors only)
- B. May meet University Creative Arts and Humanities Breadth Requirement (see catalog for all English courses that meet this requirement)
- C. Communications options: LING 101, LING 222, LEAD 209, any 3 cr. COMM course
- D. Foreign Language does not fulfill the Creative Arts/Humanities requirement. If the English requirement does not fulfill the University Creative Arts/Humanities requirement, this course should be used to fulfill that requirement.
- E. HDFS311: HDFS311 is a pre-requisite for HDFS334 (50 hour internship)
- HDFS Developmental Electives: HDFS 220, 221, 329, 339, 349 (or SOCI 349), 405, or 427. HDFS 220 and 221 require criminal background and TB clearances the semester prior to the course term.
- HDFS Families, Policy, Practice Electives: HDFS 270, 331, 403, 408, 410, 428, or 472, EDUC230
- Note: HDFS 427 may be taken as a Developmental Elective OR a Human Relationship Elective, but not both.
- \*\* Students should select an "Area of Interest" in conjunction with an academic advisor by the time they have completed HDFS 235. See advisor for details and required form. Twelve (12) credits of restricted electives are required for an "Area of Interest." These may be selected from within and outside of the College of Education and Human Development. Developmental Electives must be related to area of interest.
